



The heavy wool m/39 Battle Dress Uniform was introduced in 1939 together with the m/37 steel helmet to replace earlier uniforms. The **uniform was gray-brown-green**. The jacket was single-breasted with 4 buttons and equipped with business suit style lapels. There were two breast pockets and two side pockets. A leather belt was worn around the waist. The battledress trousers were equipped with a strap at the bottom to fasten them to the boots. Sometimes gaiters or puttees were worn to keep dirt out of the boots. The m/39 shirt and the jacket was gray. Tank crews also wore m/39 uniforms, albeit with jodhpurs. The helmet often had a net to hold camouflage. When helmets were not worn, the troops wore m/39 bätmössa or garrison cap. This uniform was used until 1958, when some were replaced by first the m/58 uniform and then finally by the m/59 cotton uniform. Standard infantry armament was the reconditioned m/1896 Mauser, thereafter designated m/38 Mauser, to some extent the more modern AG42 magazine fed Rifle, the ubiquitous m/45 Carl Gustav sub machine gun, m/39 Ksp (BAR) squad machine gun, m/48 84 mm Granatgevär. Soldiers equipped with the Mauser and the AG42 had brown leather belts with small leather ammo pouches. Soldiers using the m/45 Carl Gustav and the m/39 BAR had larger cloth ammo pouches and olive drab web gear.
